FSM Global Health Funding Opportunities

Global Health Initiative

Organization: Feinberg School of Medicine and Northwestern Medicine Primary and Specialty Care

Description: Funding is available to FSM medical students who wish to pursue a primary care rotation or project in a medically underserved area abroad through the Global Health Initiative (GHI), established by Northwestern Medicine Primary and Specialty Care (formerly CLSMA).

Eligibility: Funding for FSM students who wish to pursue a four-week primary care rotation or related project in a medically underserved area abroad.

Application Deadline/Start Date: Materials due *a minimum* of 45 days prior to proposed travel date

Description: The International Health Fellowship was established by the Feinberg School of Medicine to provide support to medical students who wish to conduct research projects at international sites.

Eligibility: M1, M3, M4 FSM students, who wish to conduct international research projects with field work lasting four to eight weeks.

Description: The Feinberg Travel Grant is meant to complement the awards given out via the Global Health Initiative by creating funds for clinical rotations and global health education programs at FSM affiliated partner institutions in Europe and Asia.

Eligibility: Support for four week clinical rotations at FSM partner institutions in developed countries.

AAMC-CDC Public Health Policy Fellowship

Organization: Association of American Medical Colleges and Centers for Disease Control

Description: The AAMC-CDC Public Health Policy Fellowship provides experiential learning opportunities for early-career physicians to understand how policies and legislation impact the health of the nation at the federal, state, and local level and enhances collaboration between clinicians and public health professionals.

Eligibility: Eligible applicants must be U.S. citizens or permanent residents, and must have completed residency training within two years of applying. Surgical residents may also apply to participate during their research year. Competitive applicants should demonstrate prior academic or practical experiences in public health and/or policy.

AfyaBora Fellowship in Global Health Leadership

Organization: AfyaBora Fellowship in Global Health Leadership

Description: The Afya Bora Consortium aims to contribute to health systems strengthening in African partner countries by implementing a leadership training program targeting African and US health professionals. The Afya Bora (“better health” in Swahili) fellowship model will focus on training leaders for HIV/AIDS prevention, care and research program

Eligibility: Must be citizen of US, Kenya, Botswana, Uganda, or Tanzania AND have an MD or MBChB with a MMed, MPH, or Master’s degree in related field

Description: The AIF Clinton Fellowship for Service gives a select group of young American professionals the opportunity to serve with Indian non-governmental organizations (NGOs) for ten months. Fellows work in the three pillar areas of AIF: Public Health, Education, & Livelihoods.

Description: The American Women's Hospitals Service (AWHS) provides small grants, up to \$1,500, for assistance with transportation costs (airfare, train fare, etc.) connected with pursuing medical studies in an off-campus setting where the medically neglected will benefit.

Eligibility: National AMWA student or resident member. Medical students must be completing their second, third or fourth year at an accredited U.S. medical school.

Arnold P. Gold Foundation Summer Research Fellowship

Organization: Arnold P. Gold Foundation

Description: The Student Summer Research Fellowship grants are modeled on NIH short-term training grants, but are awarded for research into community health and cultural competency issues, rather than laboratory work.

Eligibility: Stipend of \$3,000 are awarded for 10-week period to medical students in good academic standing at an accredited U.S. or Canadian school

Organization: The Association of Schools and Programs of Public Health

Description: The Allan Rosenfield Global Health Fellowship Program provides international training opportunities for recent graduates of ASPPH member CEPH accredited schools and

programs of public health (MPH and Doctoral level).

Eligibility: To be eligible for this program, applicants must have received their Masters or Doctorate degree prior to the beginning of the fellowship or within the last five years. Graduate degrees must come from an ASPPH member graduate school or program of public health accredited by the Council on Education for Public Health (CEPH). All applicants must be U.S. citizens or hold a visa permitting permanent residence (“Green Card”) in the U.S. to be eligible for the fellowship program.

Global Pediatric Fellowship in Health Service Delivery

Oncology Awards for Underrepresented Medical Students & Residents

Organization: Conquer Cancer Foundation

Description: The Medical Student Rotation (MSR) provides financial support for U.S. medical students from populations underrepresented in medicine to complete a clinical or clinical research oncology rotation. The Resident Travel Award (RTA) provides financial support for residents from populations underrepresented in medicine to attend ASCO's Annual Meeting. This award will allow the recipients to travel to the 2014 ASCO Annual Scientific Meeting, where they will have an opportunity to meet oncologists and to learn more about the career possibilities in oncology.

Eligibility: To qualify for MSR, applicants must be enrolled in an MD or DO, U.S. medical school program and be of an underrepresented population as defined by the program eligibility criteria. To qualify for RTA, applicants must be enrolled in an ACGME-accredited residency program required for future training in a cancer related subspecialty (i.e. Internal Medicine considering Med/Onc, Surgery considering Surg/Onc) and be of an underrepresented population as defined by the program eligibility criteria. All candidates must be U.S. citizens,

U.S. nationals or permanent residents.

Description: Seed Global Health's mission is to promote and support new generations of US health professionals to serve as global health educators and work within countries facing critical human health care resource shortages. Their greater goal is, in collaboration with their partners, to create sustainable solutions to strengthen health systems.

Eligibility: Medical volunteers will include U.S. board eligible or board certified doctors in core specialties and nursing volunteers who have completed a BNS/MPH, MSN, NP, DRN, or PHD and have a minimum number of three years of both clinical and teaching experience. Core specialties for doctors are expected to include Internal Medicine, Pediatrics (and Medicine/Pediatrics), Family Medicine, Obstetrics and Gynecology, General Surgery, or Psychiatry

South American Program in HIV Prevention Research (SAPHIR)

Organization: UCLA Program in Global Health

Description: The SAPHIR program is a year-long training program in comprehensive HIV prevention research for U.S. medical students and residents. Trainees will participate in a structured program of didactic education and practical research in one of the major fields of HIV prevention (Behavioral Prevention, Biomedical Prevention, Antiretroviral Therapy, Epidemiology, or Basic/Translational Science). Research sites are located in Lima, Peru and Rio de Janeiro, Brazil.

Eligibility: Medical students must have completed the required third-year clerkships to be eligible and may participate between the third and fourth year of medical school. Applicants who have just completed their residency program but have not begun a fellowship may also be considered. Language proficiency in Spanish or Portuguese is recommended and considered an asset but is not required.
